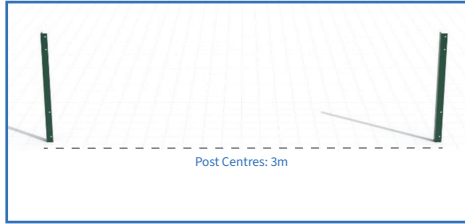


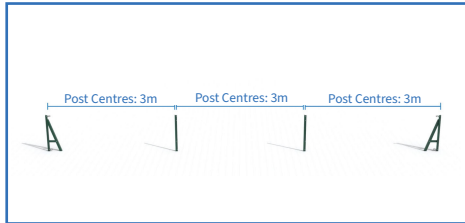
## Understanding Post Types

### Intermediate Posts



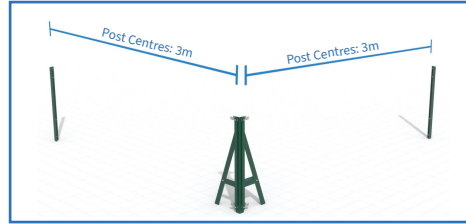
These provide support and stability between the end posts. We recommend these to be spaced 3 metres apart.

### End Strainer Posts



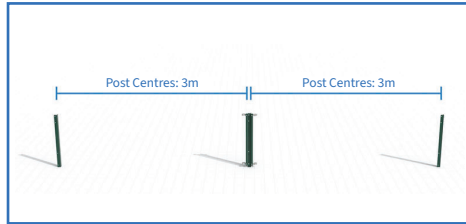
Place these at the end of every run to support and stabilise your fencing.

### Corner Strainer Posts

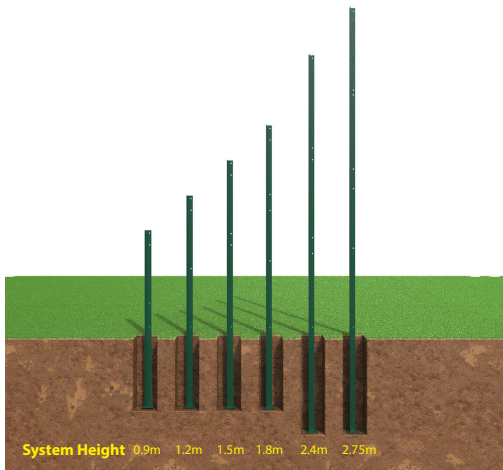


Position these at corners or any change of direction.

### Two-Way Strainer Posts



Use these on straight runs, every 30m.



## Installation Depth Guidance

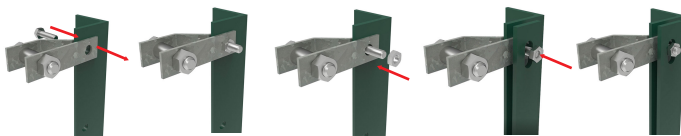
Post Height (Installed)	Post Height (Total)	Amount in the ground
900mm	1500mm	600mm
1200mm	1800mm	600mm
1500mm	2100mm	600mm
1800mm	2400mm	600mm
2400mm	3200mm	800mm
2750mm	3600mm	850mm

We suggest two bags of Post Mix or similar product per post.

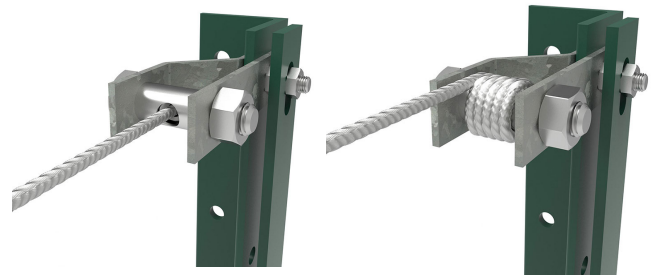
For every 25m roll, use 8 posts spaced 3.0m apart. Place end posts at the beginning and end, intermediates between them, corners to turn, and add two-way strainers every 30m on straight sections.

## Installation

Once the posts are positioned, install high tensile wires from one termination post to the next, tensioning them by hand with the provided winders. Final tensioning will be done after securing the stretcher bars and chain link.



Ferrule winder being mechanically fixed to the hole on the RSA post. The long thread passes through and is fastened with a nut.



Attachment of line wire into the ferrule winder end hole and into the spigot.

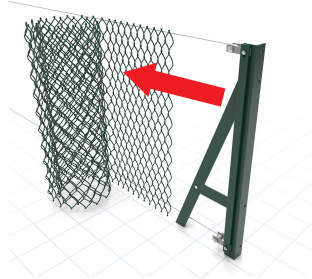

## Step-by-step installation guide

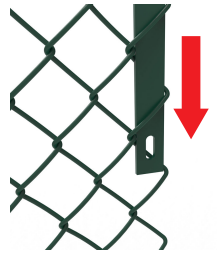
- 1 Roll Out Chain Link**  
Starting at one end of the fence line, roll chain link out on the attack face side of the fence. Unroll on a hard, flat surface to avoid dragging. Use string or rope to assist in unrolling.



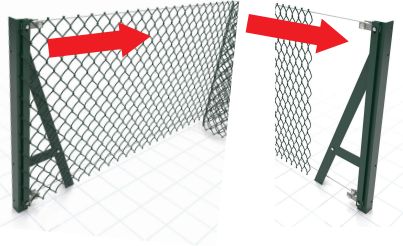
- 2 Stretch Chain Link Continuously**  
Stretch the chain link in one continuous piece between termination posts. Use an extra roll if needed to reach the end.

- 3 Weave Rolls Together**  
If the run is longer than one roll, weave in a new roll (see instructions below). Check for slipped spirals and fix them before tightening.

- 4 Attach to Strainer Post**  
After weaving the rolls, attach one end to the strainer post with a stretcher bar. Feed the stretcher bar through the chain link apertures.



- 5 Pull Chain Link to Other End**  
Manually pull the chain link to the far end, resting it against the posts or laying it on the ground until it's ready to be stretched.

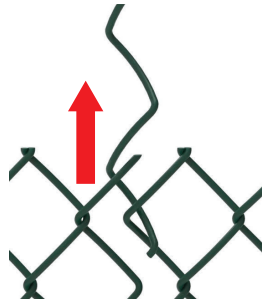


- 6 Strain the Fence Line**  
Using your straining tool of choice, tighten the fence line toward the next end post. As you go, straighten the mesh to keep the diamond shapes even and aligned.

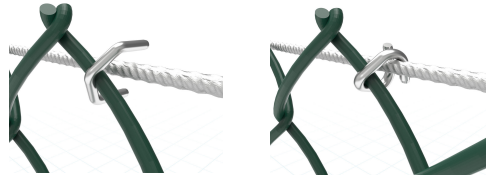
*Tip: The fabric is stretched enough when the diamonds can't be squeezed by hand and the top snaps back to the posts when pulled.*



- 7 Cut and Attach Chain Link Roll**  
Remove a strand weave to trim the chain link roll to length, then slide the tension bar into the mesh and attach it to the termination post.



- 8 Secure to Line Wires**  
Attach the chain link to the line wires using tying wire, hog rings, netting clips, or similar fasteners.



## Weaving Rolls Together

To weave rolls together, interlock the spirals. To remove a weave, unbend the twisted ends and unscrew it. To add one, lay both rolls flat and spin the weave through full diamonds in each. Twist or re-knuckle the ends to secure.

To remove excess fabric, open the top and bottom loops of a single strand of wire, then unwind the strand up through the links until the fabric comes apart.
