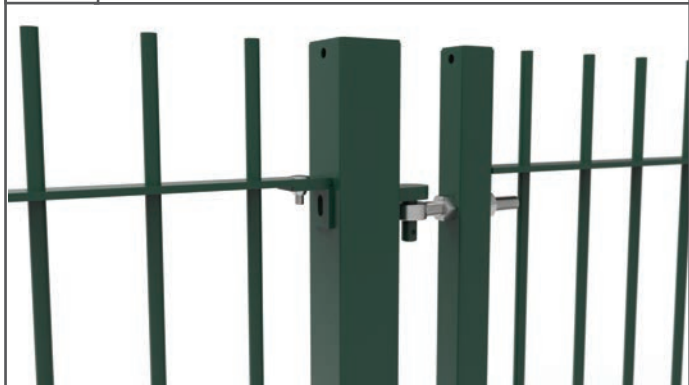
## Installation Guide


Note: The fixing methods mentioned are suggestions only. It remains the installer's responsibility to verify and select the appropriate hardware to ensure a safe and secure installation for the specific site conditions.

# Installation with self-drilling screws




1	Measure the cleat positions on the pre-installed post. Ensure the railing is square to the post.
	



2	With just the fence cleat, use a self-drilling screw to mechanically secure the cleat to the post.
	Ensure the cleat is plumb with the rest of the railing.



3	Repeat these steps for the lower cleat. Install the fencing run with supplied fixings.
	



# Installation with threaded inserts



**1** Measure the cleat positions on the pre-installed post and mark the location to drill. Ensure the railing is square to the post.



**2** Drill an appropriately sized hole into the post for the selected threaded insert.



**3** Install the threaded insert and using an appropriate tool, secure the threaded insert in the post.



**4** Install the fencing cleat with a bolt to secure into the threaded insert.



**5** Repeat these steps for the lower cleat. Install the fencing run with supplied fixings.



# Installation with expanding fasteners



**1** Measure the cleat positions on the pre-installed post and mark the location to drill. Ensure the railing is square to the post.



**2** Drill an appropriately sized hole into the post for the selected expanding fastener.



**3** Install the expanding fastener over the cleat in-situ, ensuring a strong and secure hold into the post.

**4** Repeat these steps for the lower cleat. Install the fencing run with supplied fixings.
